



QUARTZ SURFACE CARE GUIDE

This sheet is designed as an overview on how to care for your new countertops. Maintaining your new quartz countertop is easy.

Quartz is a non-porous material that is resistant to stains, scratches, and heat. However, it is NOT stain, scratch, heat, or chip PROOF. Follow the proper care and maintenance procedures to maintain the quartz surface for a lifetime of exceptional beauty and function.

STAINING

Quartz surfaces are resistant to staining; however, some chemicals, solvents, or dyes may cause permanent discoloration to the surface. Should these agents come into contact with the surface, wipe up immediately, and rinse with plenty of water.

HEAT

Quartz surfaces are NOT heat proof. To maintain the beauty and function of your countertops, DO NOT place hot skillets or roasting pans directly onto the surface. Also, be aware of the potential damage to the surface from heat generating appliances, such as electric grills or crockpots. We recommend the use of trivets and hot pads.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Simply clean with soap and hot water on a regular basis, and dry with a towel. DO NOT expose quartz surfaces to abrasive, strong alkaline, acid, free radicals, oxidizers, or like (whether high, neutral or low pH) cleaners, including bleach and ammonia. Use Rock Doctor Polish, sold at Imperial Stone, every 6 months to keep the lustrous gloss and radiant sheen of your countertops.
